LAKE SUPERIOR STATE LAKERS 3-13-2 OVERALL. 2-9-1 CCHA

FOR STARTERS

- The Lakers are coming off of a series split against the No. 17 Michigan Tech Huskies, including a 3-0 shutout victory in which junior goaltender Ethan Langenegger made 41 saves in a 3-0 shutout victory on Dec. 16. Langenegger received goal support from Benito Posa (2) and Dawson Tritt with the latter earning a point on all three Laker goals.
- Captain Louis Boudon earned the 100th point of his career with the first of three assists in a 3-2 come-from-behind overtime victory at Bemidji State on Dec. 10.
- The Lakers picked up their first points in the CCHA standings with a shootout win on the road against the Michigan Tech Huskies on
- The Lakers earned their first official win of the season with a 5-1 victory over the Clarkson Golden Knights.
- Captain Louis Boudon was named CCHA Forward of the Week on Oct. 31 after a four-point weekend (3G; 1A)
- Jake Willets appeared in the 100th game of his collegiate career on Dec. 2 against Bowling Green.
- Lake Superior State entered the season looking to build upon last year's record of 18-18-1 that ended in Game 3 of the CCHA Mason Cup Quarterfinals.
- Lakers' Head Coach Damon Whitten enters his ninth season behind the bench in Sault Ste. Marie in 2022-23. In May 2021, Whitten agreed to terms on a six-year contract, solidifying the program through the 2027-28 season. The Laker head coach has led the team to a 117-151-28 record, with playoff appearances in all but one season. Whitten recorded his 100th career win as a head coach on Oct. 2 with the Lakers 4-3 victory over No. 17 Omaha, and he led the Lakers to the WCHA Tournament Championship and first NCAA Tournament appearance in 25 years in 2021.

KWIK TRIP HOLIDAY FACE-OFF PREVIEW

- The Lakers are set to participate in the second annual Kwik Trip Holiday Face-Off at the Fiserv Forum in Milwaukee, Wis.
- LSSU will face the Wisconsin Badgers in the opening round on Dec. 28 at 7:30 p.m. Central Standard Time before taking on either Clarkson or No. 15 UMass on Dec. 29 at 4 p.m. Central Standard Time.
- The Lakers defeated Wisconsin by a score of 5-3 in the 1992 National Championship Game by a final score of 5-3 for their second NCAA championship and fourth national title overall (two NAIA championships), their only outright victory against the Badgers in seven meetings (1-4-2).
- LSSU fell to the UMass Minutemen in their most recent matchup in the opening round of the 2021 NCAA tournament before UMass went on to win the 2021 National Championship in the only meeting between the two storied programs.
- The Lakers faced Clarkson for a two-game series earlier this season in October at Taffy Abel Arena in Sault Ste. Marie, Mich., splitting the series with the Golden Knights claiming game one 4-3 in overtime before LSSU picked up their first official win of the season with a 5-1 victory the following day, keeping the all-time series even at 7-7.

#BELIEVEINBLUE

- Both the Lakers and Badgers may be currently sitting in last place of their respective conference standings, but both have found some recent success. The Lakers earned a pair of CCHA victories over the top two teams in the CCHA standings with a 3-2 overtime victory at Bemidji State after coming back from down 2-0 and a 3-0 shutout win against then No. 17 Michigan Tech, and the Badgers picked up a 6-3 upset victory over then No. 6 Michigan on Dec. 2 to cap off a five-game winning streak.

POINT PRODUCERS

- Ten different Lakers have recorded at least five points entering the Kwik Trip Holiday Face-Off.
- The Lakers' captain Louis Boudon leads the team in scoring with 14 points (7G, 7A) after 18 games.
- Bengtsson is currently leading LSSU in assists this season with eight.
- The Lakers returned three of their top five point-scorers from the previous season, incuding Boudon who led his team in every offensive statistical category.
- The Lakers were one of 15 teams in Division I to have two or more 30-point scorers after the 2021-22 regular season.
- Since the 1996-97 seasons, 20 Laker skaters have hit the 30-point plateau. The duo of Boudon and Miroslav Mucha (since transferred to Michigan State) marks the ninth and 10th Laker skaters to reach the 30-point milestone in the last 10 seasons, with eight of those coming since the 2016-17 season.
- It marks the fifth time since the 1996-97 season that two Laker teammates have recorded 30 or more points in a season. The last time two or more Lakers reached 30-points in a single season was in 2018-19 when Diego Cuglietta (41), Max Humitz (35), and Anthony Nellis (33) all hit the milestone.
- Boudon's 44 points this season are the most by a Laker in a single-season since 1996-97 when Joe Blaznek recorded 46 points (22G, 24A), joining Diego Cuglietta as the only Lakers to reach the 40-point mark in a season in 25 years.
- With 29 assists last season Boudon had registered the most assists in a single season since Keith Aldridge and Brian Felsner each had 36 in 1995-96.
- Bengtsson recorded 27 points in his sophomore season as a defenseman (36, 24A), and his 24 single-season assists are the most assists by a defenseman since Keith Aldridge totaled 36 assists during the 1995-96 season.
- Nine different Lakers recorded a point in a 4-4 tie against Omaha on Oct. 15.

IN THE POLLS

- The Lakers received nine points in the Preseason USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine Men's College Hockey Poll on Sept. 19.
- The Lakers had received votes and/or was ranked, in at least one of the two national polls (USCHO and USA Today/USA Hockey) for 25 weeks straight, from back to Nov. 23, 2020 through Nov. 15, 2021.
- In the CCHA Preseason Coaches Poll, Lake Superior State was picked to finish in the sixth spot, receiving 45 total points.

RETURN TO THE CCHA

- Lake Superior State made a long-anticipated return to the Central Collegiate Hockey Association in the 2021-22 season, joining six other former WCHA teams (Bemidji State, Bowling Green, Ferris State, Michigan Tech, Minnesota State, Northern Michigan) and St. Thomas, who had transitioned from Division II to Division I in hockey. Augustana is set to join the CCHA as its ninth member, playing two transitional seasons beginning in 2023-24 before playing their first full CCHA schedule in the 2025-26 season.
- Lake Superior State swept the St. Thomas Tommies in a two-game home series, winning the opener by a 3-1 score and capping off the weekend with a 6-3 victory in their first series of the newly reestablished CCHA.
- The CCHA schedule includes 26 regular season games for the Lakers followed by the conference postseason. The postseason will include a three-game quarterfinal round during the first weekend in March, followed by single game semifinal round and championship game during the second weekend of March. The regular season CCHA champion will be awarded the historic MacNaughton Cup while the conference postseason champion will earn the Mason Cup.
- The Lakers were one of the founding members of the CCHA in 1971 and played in the highly-regarded conference until the league was disbanded in 2013.
- During the Lakers tenure in the CCHA, the program combined for its most successful years which included three Regular Season CCHA Championships, four CCHA Postseason Championships, and three National Championships.

2022-23 LAKER FIRSTS

- Four skaters made their collegiate debut in the opening weekend against Omaha. Jordan Venegoni, Connor Milburn, and transfer Jared Kucharek made their debuts on Oct. 14 with Bryan Huggins making his debut on Oct. 15.
- Goaltender Easton Hesse made his collegiate debut between the pipes in relief of Langenegger on Dec. 2 against Bowling Green.
- Venegoni scored his first collegiate goal against then No. 5 Michigan, and he picked up his first career assist at Michigan Tech.
- Milburn scored his first career goal with 1.7 seconds remaining in regulation to force overtime against Clarkson on Oct. 28.
- Kucharek earned his first official point in a Laker uniform on Oct. 15 with an assist against Omaha, his first point since the 2019-20 season.

2021-22 LAKER FIRSTS

- Six skaters made their collegiate debut at Omaha during the first weekend of play. Timo Bakos, Cole Craft, Grant Hindman, Josh Nixon, and Dawson Tritt all played their first game as a Laker on Oct. 2 while Brett Roloson made his debut on Oct. 3. Transfers Harrison Roy and Jake Willets both made their Laker debut on Oct. 2 at UNO. Sebastian Miedema made his debut on Oct. 23 against Union.





- Tritt scored his first collegiate goal in his Laker debut on Oct. 2, marking his first collegiate point as well.
- Roy tallied his first points as a Laker in his first game as the sophomore forward tallied the game-tying goal with 1:04 left in regulation and an assist against the Omaha Mavericks on Oct. 2.
- Roloson scored his first collegiate goal on Oct. 9 at No. 3 Michigan, while classmates Timo Bakos and Josh Nixon recorded the assists to each tally their first collegiate points.
- Sophomore forward Joshua Wildauer scored his first collegiate goal on Oct. 9 at No. 3 Michigan and junior Logan Jenuwine, a transfer from Arizona State, registered his first point as a Laker with the lone assist on the goal.
- Junior defenseman Jake Willets, a transfer from Ferris State, tallied his first point in an LSSU jersey with an assist on Oct. 16 in the team's 6-3 win over St. Thomas.
- Freshman forward Dawson Tritt recorded a goal and an assist in the Lakers sweep over St. Thomas last weekend, which earned him CCHA Rookie of the Week honors. Tritt notched the secondary assist on the empty net goal in Friday's 3-1 win over the Tommies and followed with a highlight reel goal on Saturday night.
- Bakos scored his first collegiate goal on Friday, Oct. 22 in the team's 7-4 win over Union and followed with a hat trick in the team's 5-2 win over the Dutchmen in the series closer. For his play in the weekend series against Union, Bakos was named the CCHA's Rookie of the Week on Oct. 25.
- Nixon scored his first collegiate goal in the team's 5-2 win on Oct. 23 against Union with an empty net goal in the final two minutes of play. The freshman forward also had three assists in the game to set a career-high in single game points with four (16, 3A). Following the first month of the season, Nixon was named CCHA Rookie of the Month as he led all first-year skaters in the conference in points with eight (16, 7A) in 10 games played.
- In the team's 7-1 win over St. Lawrence on Oct. 30, forward Cole Craft recorded his first collegiate point with an assist.
- Craft netted his first collegiate goal in the Lakers 4-2 loss to Bemidji State on Nov. 13 and the night prior, the freshman forward recorded his first career multi-point game with a pair of assists.
- Sophomore forward Tyler Williams recorded his first collegiate point with an assist in the team's 6-1 win over Northern Michigan on Jan. 28. Williams scored his first collegiate goal in the team's 5-1 win at St. Thomas on Feb. 19.

WELCOME BACK

- The Lakers return 15 forwards (Louis Boudon, Spencer DenBeste, Jack Jeffers, Benito Posa, Brandon Puricelli, Joshua Wildauer, Tyler Williams, Timo Bakos, Cole Craft, Brett Roloson, Dawson Tritt, Jordan Venegoni), seven defensemen (Jacob Bengtsson, Artyom Borshyov, Jeremy Gervais, Arvid Henrikson, Grant Hindman, Sebastian Miedema, Jake Willets), and all three goaltenders (Seth Eisele, Ethan Langenegger, Easton Hesse) from last season's roster.
- Lake Superior's skaters will return 69.2% of last season's goal scoring (74 of 107 total goals), and 74% of the total points recorded (222 of 300 total points).
- Six of the Lakers top 10 point scorers from last season are back this season (Boudon, Bengtsson, Puricelli, Jenuwine, Roy, Willets) and three of the team's top five goal scorers (Boudon, Puricelli, Jenuwine).
- Last season the Lakers had 12 players record 10 or more points with eight of those skaters returning this season (Boudon, Bengtsson, Puricelli, Jenuwine, Roy, Willets, Posa, Tritt).
- Seven returners for the Lakers scored at least one game winning goal last season (Boudon, Puricelli, Bakos, Bengtsson, Jenuwine, Tritt).
- The goaltending duo of Eisele and Langenegger combined for an 18-18-1 record last season as Langenegger played in 22 games for the Lakers while Eisele appeared in 16 contests. Langenegger posted a .912 save percentage and a 2.65 goals against average during his sophomore season while Eisele recorded a .911 save percentage and a 2.73 goals against average for the Lakers.

"FRESH" FACES

- The Lakers welcome a pair of freshmen to the 2022-23 team in defenseman Bryan Huggins and forward Connor Milburn.
- -Huggins spent the 2021-22 season playing for the Fargo Force of the USHL, and posted 11 points (16, 10A) as a defenseman. He has also competed for the Maryland Black Bears (NAHL), Kenai River Brown Bears (NAHL), Muskegon Lumberjacks (USHL), and the Austin Bruins (NAHL).
- Milburn played three seasons of junior hockey with the Chilliwack Chiefs of the BCHL where he served as an assistant captain in 2020-21 and captain in 2021-22. Posted 23 points (9G, 14A) in his most recent season with Chilliwack, while helping his team to 33 wins.

PORTAL PICKUP

• The Lakers brought in fifth-year senior Jared Kucharek who previously spent the last four seasons with the Western Michigan Broncos (NCAA) where he totaled 13 points (1G, 12A) as a defenseman. Prior to Western Michigan, he was the leading scorer among defensemen for the Madison Capitols of the USHL with 22 points (5G, 17A).

COMING OFF CAREER YEARS

- A number of Lakers have bested their previous season-high totals in various offensive categories last year.
- Junior forward Tyler Williams set new season-highs in goals (1), assists (1), and points (2).
- Junior defenseman Jacob Bengtsson set new season-highs in goals (3), assists (24), points (27), and power play goals (2). As a freshman, Bengtsson posted two goals and five assists for seven points in 28 games played. Bengtsson has posted the most assists by a Laker defenseman since Keith Aldridge totaled 36 assists during the 1995-96 season.
- Junior defenseman Arvid Henrikson set new season highs in assists (5) and points (5).
- Senior defenseman Jake Willets set a new season highs in goals (6) and tied his previous season-high in power play goals (2).
- Senior forward Logan Jenuwine set new career highs in goals (9), assists (11) and points (20). During the 2019-20 season at Arizona State, Jenuwine totaled four points (3G, 1A) in 10 games.
- Senior forward Brandon Puricelli set new season-highs in goals (13), assists (9), points (22), power play goals (5) and game winning goals (3). Two of Puricelli's three game winning goals this season have come in overtime.
- Junior forward Harrison Roy set new career highs in goals (7), assists (12), points (19), power play goals (3), and game winning goals (2). Roy spent the 2020-21 season at Boston College, where he posted three points (26, 1A) in 23 games.
- Junior forward Joshua Wildauer has set new season-highs in goals (2), assists (6) and points (8). Wildauer posted one assist in 13 games as a freshman.
- Junior defenseman Artyom Borshyov totaled four assists last season to set season-highs in both assists and points. In 13 games as a freshman,

the defenseman did not record any points.

- Junior defenseman Jeremy Gervais posted four assists last season setting new season-highs in both assists (4) and points (4). In 16 games as a freshman, Gervais totaled two assists.
- Junior forward Benito Posa set new career-highs in goals (5), assists (6) and points (11) as he reached the double-digit mark for the first time in his Laker careeer.
- Junior forward Louis Boudon set a new season-high in goals (15), assists (29), points (44), power play goals (5), shorthanded goals (3), game winning goals (4), and hat tricks (2).
- Senior goaltender Seth Eisele set new season-highs in games played (16), games started (16) and wins (8) while junior netminder Ethan Langenegger set new season-highs in starts (22), games played (22), shutouts (3), and wins (10).

CENTURY CLUB

- Boudon leads the team with 115 games played, and he reached the 100 game milestone in a 3-1 victory over Bowling green in the 2021-22 regular season finale.
- Senior Jack Jeffers reached the 100 game milestone on Jan. 8, 2022 at Bemidji State. The forward has appeared in 31 career games for the Lakers, and 71 career games for the UAH Chargers during the 2018-20 seasons.
- Henrikson reached the milestone in Game 2 of the opening round in the 2022 Mason Cup Playoffs
- Jake Willets reached the 100 game milestone on Dec. 2 against Bowling Green. The senior had appeared in 52 games for the Ferris State Bulldogs during the 2019-21 seasons.
- Boudon scored his 100th career point with his first assist at Bemidji State on Dec. 9 en route to assisting on all three Laker goals to help his team come back from down 2-0 for the Lakers' first official CCHA victory of the season and a four-point weekend individually.

KEYS TO SUCCESS

- LSSU has posted a 74-61-10 overall record since the start of the 2018-19 season through the close of the 2021-22 season.
- Three of the team's six wins over ranked opponents last season were on the road.
- Since the start of the 2018-19 season, the Lakers have combined for a 45-8-3 record when scoring the game's first goal.
- Another key to the Lakers success in recent years (since the 2018-19 season) has been the team's ability to preserve a lead as Lake Superior State

has posted a 36-3-4 record when leading after the first period and a 50-1-1 record when heading into the third period with the score advantage. Last year, the Lakers recorded a 11-3-1 record when notching the game's opening goal, a 11-2-1 record when leading after one period, and a 12-0-0 record when leading after two periods of play.

AGE BEFORE BEAUTY

- The Lakers enter the season with the third oldest team by average age (22.9) in division I.
- The team's two freshmen is the lowest among all division I programs.
- The Lakers' return 74% of last season's total point production which is among the top 15 marks in division I.

ANCHORED DOWN

- Heading into the 2022-23 season, the Lakers return a combined 309 games worth of experience on the back line.
- Bengtsson was named to the 2022 All-CCHA Second Team and has also received 2022 Preseason All-CCHA honors.

BETWEEN THE PIPES

- •The Lakers return all three goaltenders from last season in senior Seth Eisele, sophomore Ethan Langenegger, and sophomore Easton Hess. Through 3y games last season, the duo of Eisele and Langenegger split goaltending duties for the Lakers with Eisele starting 15 games and Langenegger starting 22 games. The pair had combined for a .911 save percentage and 2.80 goals against average.
- In 22 starts last season, Langenegger posted a 10-11-1 overall record with a .912 save percentage and a 2.65 goals against average. The junior goaltender set new career highs in wins (10), starts (22), games played (22) and shutouts (3) last season. Among CCHA goaltenders, Langenegger ranked third in save percentage (.912), seventh in saves per game (27.36), third in goals against average (2.65), and seventh in saves (602).
- Langenegger set a new single-game career high in saves when he stopped 46 shots of the 51 shots that he faced in the team's 5-1 loss to Bemidji State on Jan. 7, 2022.
- In 15 games played last season, Eisele totaled a 2.64 goals against average and a .915 save percentage while recording a 8-6-0 record. Eisele set season-highs in games played (15), starts (15) and wins (8) last season. Among CCHA goaltenders, Eisele ranked fourth in save percentage (.911) (.001 behind Langenegger), first in saves per game (27.93), and fourth in goals against average (2.73).
- Eisele set a new career single-game best in the Lakers 6-1 loss to No. 3 Michigan on Oct. 8, 2021 when he stopped 41 shots in the game.

HOW SWEDE IT IS

- The Lakers have three skaters who hail from Sweden on their roster this season: senior defenseman Arvid Henrikson, junior defenseman Jacob Bengtsson, and sophomore defenseman Sebastian Miedema.
- Senior defenseman Arvid Henrikson, a native of Stockholm, Sweden, has been a consistent presence on the back end for the Lakers during the past three seasons.

Henrikson has appeared in 101 career games for the Lakers, including 35 during the 2021-22 season.

- Henrikson was drafted by the Montreal Canadiens in the 2016 NHL Entry Draft.
- Junior defenseman Jacob Bengtsson, a native of Stockholm, Sweden, enters his third season of collegiate hockey after being a key member of the Laker defense last season. Bengtsson played in 36 games for the Lakers last season and ranked third on the team in points (36, 24A).
- As a sophomore, Bengtsson set new career highs in goals (3), assists (24) and points (27). Two of Bengtsson's three goals last season have came on the power play. Bengtsson has posted the most assists by a Laker defenseman since Keith Aldridge totaled 36 assists during the 1995-96 season.
- Bengtsson was named to the 2022 All-CCHA Second Team and the Preseason 2022 All-CCHA squad.
- Both of Bengtsson's goals during his freshman year stood as game winning goals as he netted the third goal in the Lakers 5-2 win against No. 17 Bemidji State on March 3 and the second goal in the Lakers 4-1 win over No. 13/12 Bemidji on March 19 in the WCHA Semifinals.
- Bengtsson ranked first among all WCHA rookies in game winning goals during the 2020-21 season, and was tied for second in game winners among all WCHA defensemen.
- Sophomore defenseman Sebastian Miedema, a native of Gävle, Sweden, rounds out the Laker skaters from Sweden. Miedema made his Laker debut on Oct. 23, 2021 against Union.

FRENCH CONNECTION

- Senior forward, and team captain, Louis Boudon will be looked upon for leadership both on-and-off the ice this season as he will be a driving force behind the team's offense this season.
- Boudon is only the fourth multi-year captain in program history.
- Boudon enters the 2022-23 season ranked in the top-five among active division I players in career points (90, T4th) and career assists (61, T5th)
- Boudon has notched 90 points (29G, 61A) in 103 career games for the Lakers, and ranks first among all active Lakers in career points.
- In 2021-22, Boudon recorded points in 23 contests, and posted 14 multi-point games. The forward led the





Lakers in points with 44, as he has posted 15 goals and 29 assists. Through 36 games, Boudon set a new career-high in goals (15), assists (29), points (44), power play goals (5), shorthanded goals (3), and game winning goals (4).

- With 44 points last season, Boudon reached the 40-point plateau for the first time in his career and has recorded the most points by a Laker in a single season since 1996-97 when Joe Blaznek recorded 46 points (226, 24A).
- Boudon scored his second game winning goal of the 2021-22 season and the fifth of his career in the
 team's 1-0 win over No. 1 Minnesota State on Nov. 26, 2021. The senior forward netted his first career
 shorthanded goal in the first period against the Mavericks which would hold up as the eventual game
 winner to upset the top-ranked team in the nation.
- In 2020-21, Boudon finished his second collegiate season with 19 points in 28 games as he scored eight goals and added 11 assists. The Grenoble, France native set new season-bests in goals, power play goals, and game winning goals as a sophomore.
- The Laker captain ranked in the top-five among his teammates in nearly every offensive category last season as he was tied for third in goals (8), tied for fourth in assists (11), tied for third in points (19), fourth in plus/minus (+15), tied for third in game winning goals (2), and led the team in power play goals (4).
- Boudon closed out the 2020-21 season with 14 points (5G, 9A) in the team's last 15 games of the season.
- As a freshman, Boudon appeared in 40 games for the Lakers, was third on the Lakers in points with 27 and ranked first among his teammates in assists with 21 during his first collegiate season. The forward was named to the WCHA All-Rookie Team, WCHA Rookie of the Week twice during the 2019-20 season, WCHA Rookie of the Month in February, and received the Lakers Outstanding Freshman Award.
- In 2019-20, Boudon was tied for third on the team in goals, second on the team in +/-. tied for second on the team in power play goals, led the team in power play points, and third on the team in shots on goal.

CCHA HONORS

- Senior forward Louis Boudon and junior defenseman Jacob Bengtsson were each named to the 2022 All-CCHA Second Team after the 2021-22 season, and both also received 2022 Preseason All-CCHA honors.

NONCONFERENCE SLATE

- The Lakers play all of their 2022-23 nonconference series on home ice.
- The Lakers opened the regular season with a series against Nebraska-Omaha, including a shootout victory for the Lakers in the second game of the series that was officially ruled as a tie.
- The Lakers welcomed No. 5 Michigan to Taffy Abel Arena for Great Lake State Weekend on Oct. 21 and 22.
- The Lakers came away with a split against the Clarkson Golden Knights after falling in overtime in game one despite coming back from two goals down in the final minutes to tie the game with 1.7 seconds remaining with Connor Milburn's first career goal and winning game two in dominant fashion by a score of 5-1 behind two goals from Boudon.
- The team rounds out nonconference play at the KwikTrip Holiday Face-Off in Milwaukee, Wis. on Dec. 28 and 29. They open the four-team tournament against the Wisconsin Badgers and will then face either Clarkson or Massachusetts.

STRONG STARTS

- In his tenure at LSSU, Whitten has led the Lakers to a 5-3-1 record in season openers and a 6-2-1 record in home openers at the Taffy Abel Arena.

AROUND THE WORLD

• The Lakers roster consists of players from six different home countries, including Belarus, Canada, France, Germany, Sweden, and the United States. 16 players hail from the U.S., six from Canada, three from Sweden, and one from Belarus, France, and Germany.

MICHIGAN BORN & BRED

- LSSU has a strong Michigan presence, with ten skaters hailing from the state (Bryan Huggins, Tyler Williams, Jake Willets, Logan Jenuwine, Spencer DenBeste, Joshua Wildauer, Grant Hindman, Jordan Venegoni, Jared Kucharek, and Benito Posa)
- It marks the most Michiganders on the roster since the 2007-08 season (which also had 10).
- In addition, two of the Laker coaches (Damon Whitten and Mike York) are from the state of Michigan.

LEADING THE LAKERS

- Junior forward Louis Boudon will once again serve as the Lakers captain for the 2022-23 season, making him the fourth multi-year captain in program history.
- Bengtsson and Jeffers will serve as alternate captains.
- Highlighting the team's international roster, all three team captains come from different home countries (France, Sweden, U.S.).

HOCKEY SMARTS

- Ten student-athletes were named 2021-22 CCHA Scholar-Athlete Award recipients: Ethan Langenegger, Mitchell Oliver, Logan Jenuwine, Dustin Manz, Miroslav Mucha, Jacob Nordqvist, Joshua Wildauer, Artyom Borshyov, Louis Boudon, and Seth Eisele. To earn recognition as a CCHA Scholar Athlete, student-athletes must have a grade point average of at least 3.50 on a (4.00 scale) for the most recently completed semester, or quarter, at the present institution or had an overall cumulative GPA of at least 3.50.
- Six Lakers Artyom Borshyov, Easton Hesse, Grant Hindman, Logan Jenuwine, Miroslav Mucha, and Josh Nixon, were named 2021-22 American Hockey Coaches Association (AHCA) Krampade All-American Scholars. To qualify, a student-athlete must have attained at least a 3.6 GPA during both the fall and spring semesters.

1000 WINS

- On March 19, 2021, the Lake Superior State hockey program recorded its 1,000th all-time win with a 4-1 victory over the Bemidji State Beavers in the WCHA Semifinals. In the storied history of LSSU hockey, the program has combined for a 1,017-885-175 all-time record in 56 total seasons of competition.
- Since the program's inception in 1966, Lake Superior State reached 1,000 wins in 2,037 games, totaling
 a .533 win percentage en route to the milestone victory.
 The Lakers became the fourth NCCA Division
 I program that was founded after 1946 to reach 1,000 wins, joining Bemidji State, Denver, and Bowling Green.

PRESEASON RECAP

- The Lakers went 1-2 in their three-game exhibition slate to open the season.
- The Lakers fell to the Michigan Tech Huskies in their opening exhibition game of the 2022-23 season by a final score of 5-2 on Saturday, Oct. 1.
- Despite the loss, senior forward Logan Jenuwine impacted the game by earning a point on each of the Lakers' goals in the contest (2 assists), and was the only Laker to finish with a positive +/- (+2).
- Junior forward Harrison Roy and junior defenseman Artyom Borshyov were the two goal-scorers in the contest.
- Junior Goaltender Ethan Langenegger recorded 35 saves.
- The Lakers defeated Nipissing in their second exhibition of the weekend in dominant fashion by a final score of 6-1.
- Lake Superior State scored four unanswered goals in the opening eight minutes, including an unassisted goal from Roy 18 seconds into the game.
- The goalscorers for the Lakers were Roy, Jenuwine, Boudon, Bakos (2), and Roloson with a total of eight different Lakers earning points.
- Langenegger earned the win after 20 minutes between the pipes, but sophomore goaltender Easton Hesse fended off all 16 shots he faced in relief duty.
- The Lakers' penalty kill was a perfect 11-11 after their first two exhibitions.
- Jared Kucharek scored a goal shortly after coming out of the penalty box against the USNTDP U-18 squad, his first point since the 2019-20 season.
- Despite allowing their first power play goal, the Lakers' penalty kill had an impressive preseason, holding off their opponents scoreless in 14 out of 15 extra-man opportunities.
- Roy and Jenuwine continued their impressive preseasons offensively, earning a point in all three exhibition contests.

THE 2022-23 SEASON SO FAR

- The Lakers opened the regular season with a home series against Nebraska-Omaha. In the second game of the series, nine different Lakers scored a point, and three stops by Langenegger paired with a made attempt from Bakos preserved a shootout victory on Oct. 15.
- Sophomore forward Jordan Venegoni scored the first goal of his collegiate career against No. 5 Michigan on Oct. 21.
- Freshman Forward Connor Milburn earned his first career points in an overtime loss to Clarkson, including his first career goal with 1.7 seconds remaining to force overtime.
- The Lakers earned their first official win of the season on Oct. 29 against Clarkson after Boudon's shorthanded empty-netter secured the 5-1 victory.
- Goaltender Ethan Langenegger earned his first career point with a forward pass for a power play goal.
- Boudon was named CCHA Forward of the week after having four points in a weekend split with Clarkson.
- The Lakers fell in both games against NMU to open CCHA play, but Roy emphatically announced his return from injury with a goal in each contest of the series.
- LSSU picked up their first points in the CCHA standings on Nov. 11 with a shootout win on the road against Michigan Tech after Langennegger stopped 42 shots before also stopping two out of three Husky attempts in the shootout.
- The Lakers fell in both contests on the road at St. Thomas with Posa as the lone goal scorer on the weekend.
- LSSU fell in both games of the home series against Bowling Green, despite a strong offensive showing on Friday, Dec. 2 in which the Lakers scored four goals in the 100th career game for Jake Willets.
- The Lakers came back from down 2-0 to earn a 3-2 overtime victory at Bemidji State after Bengtsson scored the game-tying goal with 24 seconds remaining in regulation after Langenegger was pulled during a penalty kill in favor of an extra attacker. Bengtsson would later find Puricelli for the game-winner in overtime.
- Ethan Langenegger would once again save one of his best performances of his career for the No. 17 Michigan Tech Huskies, making 41 saves en route to a 3-0 shutout victory in the first game of what would ultimately result in a series split. Langenegger would receive goal support from Benito Posa and Dawson Tritt with the latter earning a point on all three Laker goals.

REWIND: THE 2021-22 SEASON

- Lake Superior State finished the 2021-22 season with an overall record of 18-18-1 and a 13-13-0 mark in CCHA play as the team earned home ice in the opening round of the Mason Cup Playoffs before falling to Northern Michigan in three games.
- Three Lakers received all conference honors following the end of the CCHA regular season. Forward Louis Boudon defenseman Jacob Bengtsson earned All-CCHA Second Team Honors while Josh Nixon was named to the CCHA All-Rookie Team.
- On 18 occasions, a Laker received either CCHA Player of the Week or Player of the Month honors.
- The Lakers season finished with three players among the top-30 scorers in the CCHA. 21 Lakers recorded

at least a point during the 2021-22 seaon and eight skaters posted at least 15 points at the close of the 37 game season. 18 players scored a goal for the Lakers last season with 12 of them scoring four or more goals. The Lakers 18 game winning goals this season were scored by 10 different players.

LAKERS IN THE PROS

- Former Laker Buddy Robinson (2011-13) played in nine games for the Calgary Flames. Robinson played 45 games for the Flames AHL affiliate, the Stockton Heat, and posted 32 points (18G, 14A). Robinson was signed by the Chicago Blackhawks in 2022.
- Former Laker Kevin Czuczman, who played 13 games with the New York Islanders during the 2013-14 season, made his debut with the Pittsburgh Penguins on Jan. 28, 2021 following years in the American Hockey League. Czuczman played two games for the Penguins during the 2020-21 season.
- A number of former Lakers are currently on AHL contracts for the '21-22 season including Mareks mitens, 2017-21 (Utica Comets)
- A number of former Lakers are currently on ECHL contracts for the '21-22 season including Anthony Nellis, 2015-19 (Trois-Rivieres Lions); Diego Cuglietta, 2015-19 (Indy Fuel); Max Humitz, 2016-20 (Kalamazoo Wings); Collin Saccoman, 2016-20 (Kalamazoo Wings); Yuki Miura, 2017-21 (Iowa Heartlanders).
- Kevin Czuczman, 2011-14 played in the Liiga (Ilves) during the '21-22 season
- Sophomore defenseman Arvid Henrikson was drafted by the Montreal Canadiens in the 2016 NHL Entry Draft in the Seventh Round (187th overall).

HEAD COACH DAMON WHITTEN



Damon Whitten enters his ninth season leading the Lake Superior State men's ice hockey program in 2022-23. In his tenure as head coach at LSSU, Whitten has been dedicated to returning the program to prominence, leading the team to six Western Collegiate Hockey Association (WCHA) playoff appearances, including the program's first WCHA Championship in 2021. In addition, Whitten guided the team to its first NCAA Tournament appearance in 25 years during the 2020-21 season as well as the first Great Lakes Invitational Championship in program history. In his seven seasons at Lake Superior State, Whitten has led the program to a 117-151-28 overall record.

Whitten, who was named the 10th head coach of Laker hockey on April 25, 2014, is highly respected among his collegiate hockey coaching peers and known for being an enthusiastic, tireless worker. Following the 2020-21 season, Whitten signed a six-year contract extension with the Lakers, soldifying the program through the 2027-28 season.

Under Whitten's direction, the Lakers have had numerous student-athletes attain conference and national recognition. 16 players have received All Conference honors including one First Team (Diego Cuglietta, 2019), seven Second Team (Mitch Hults, 2017; Max Humitz, 2020; Ashton Calder, 2021; Will Riedell, 2021; Mareks Mitens, 2021; Louis Boudon, 2022; Jacob Bengtsson, 2022), four Third Team (Gordon Defiel, 2016; Max Humitz, 2019; Anthony Nellis, 2019; Pete Veillette, 2021) and four Rookie Team (Max Humitz, 2017; Ashton Calder, 2019; Louis Boudon, 2020; Josh Nixon, 2022).

Nine Lakers have been nominated for the Hobey Baker Award during Whitten's tenure (Diego Cuglietta, 2019; Anthony Nellis, 2019; Max Humitz, 2020; Mareks Mitens, 2020; Ashton Calder, 2021; Lukas Kaelble, 2021; Mareks Mitens, 2021; Jacob Bengtsson, 2022; Louis Boudon, 2022). Other award nominees for the Lakers since the 2014-15 season include the Google Cloud Academic All-District At-Large Team (Nick Kossoff, 2019), Hockey Humitarian Award nominee (Nick Kossoff, 2019), Top 20 Finalist for the Senior CLASS Award (Collin Saccoman, 2020), Top 10 Finalist for the Senior CLASS Award (Max Humitz, 2020) and a finalist for the Mike Richter Award (Mareks Mitens, 2021).

Academically, Whitten's teams at Lake Superior State have excelled. His teams have consistently posted team GPAs above 3.3 and have had a strong presence on the WCHAS academic teams. 45 student-athletes have earned WCHA Scholar Athlete status including nine in 2020-21, and 101 student-athletes have received WCHA All-Academic accolades, including 16 in 2020-21. Since its inception in the 2017-18 season, 26 Lakers have been named AHCA All-American Scholars.

In addition to his coaching accomplishments, Whitten has established himself as a dedicated and involved member of the LSSU campus community as well as the greater Sault Ste. Marie region. The seventh-year coach has been devoted to an off-ice goal of increased community involvement, connection with the student body, and excellence in the classroom.

In 2017, the Laker hockey team was awarded Community Partner of the Year by the United Way of the Eastern Upper Peninsula for their involvement in outreach events throughout the Sault Ste. Marie community. Whitten and the Lakers have remained active in the community through initiatives like Pink in the Rink/Check.Slash.Survive, the United Way's Annual Thanksgiving Food Drive and the Light the Lamp game.

Whitten has been committed to creating relationships with alumni, fans, and current Lake State students in order to continue the proud tradition of Laker hockey. One of Whitten's biggest initiatives since arriving at Lake State has been the implementation of Laker Legion, a student fan organization that aims to spread Laker pride from the stands of the Taffty Abel Arena to the campus and community.

During the most recent season, Witten led the Lakers to an 18-18-1 overall record, including a 13-14 mark in the program's first season in the newly reestablished CCHA. He would guide the Lakers to a 1-0 statement win on Nov. 26 when the team upset then No. 1 ranked, and eventual national runner-up, Minnesota State. Louis Boudon and Jacob Bengtsson bother earned All-CCHA honors while Josh Nixon was named to the CCHA All-Rookie Team.

In the 2020-21 season, Whitten guided the Lakers to a historic season as the team finished the regular season second in the WCHA standings, won the program's first WCHA Championship, advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in 25 years, posted the program's 1,000th all-time win, and ended the season with the program's highest win percentage in 25 years. The Lakers season came to a close in the NCAA Tournament as the team fell to the eventual national champion, UMass, in the opening round of the East Regional. Among the many strong individual performances during the 2020-21 season was Whitten's starting goaltender, Mareks Mitens, who finished as a finalist for the Mike Richter Award, which is awarded to the top goaltender in Division I hockey.

The Lakers finished the 2019-20 season with a 14-23-4 overall record and a 11-14-4 WCHA record. At the conclusion of the regular season, the Lakers held the seventh place spot in the WCHA standings to qualify for the playoffs for the fifth time under Whitten's watch. The season was highlighted by the Lakers game against the University of Alabama Huntsville on Feb. 15, 2020 as LSSU competed in the first NCAA Division I hockey game played in Canada since 2012 as the game took place at the GFL Memorial Gardens in Sault Ste Marie, Ontario. Whitten was a major supporter of the initiative and has been an advocate for growing the game of hockey in both of the Twin Saults. Max Humitz was named to the All-WCHA Second Team while freshman forward Louis Boudon was named to the WCHA All-Rookie Team.

In 2018-19, Whitten led the Lakers to their most successful season since he became head coach. The Lakers won the most games in a season for the program since 1995-96 as the team posted a 23-13-2 overall record and a 16-10-2 mark

in WCHA competition. Additionally, the Lakers eclipsed 20 wins for the first time since the 2006-07 season, recorded the program's longest winning streak since 1996-97 (seven games), swept Ferris State in a road series for the first time since 1993-94, swept Michigan Tech in a series for the first time since 1983-84, and won the first Great Lakes Invitational Championship in program history. On an individual level, Whitten coached forward Diego Cuglietta, who finished the season as the national leader in goals scored with 25. The Lakers would host a WCHA playoff series for the first time in program history and captured a WCHA playoff series win for the first time as the Lakers defeated the Bemidji State Beavers in the Quarterfinals. The Lakers spent 10 consecutive weeks during the season ranked in the USCHO Poll. The team's historic season would come to an end in the WCHA Semifinals as the Lakers fell to Minnesota State. Following the season, Cuglietta received All-WCHA First Team recognition, Max Humitz and Anthony Nellis were named to the All-WCHA Third Team and freshman Ashton Calder was named to the All-WCHA Rookie Team.

In his tenure with the Lakers, the only season that the team did not qualify for the WCHA playoffs was in 2017-18. Whitten's team finished the season with a 10-22-4 record and a 8-17-3 mark in conference play.

The 2016-17 season saw Whitten guide the Lakers to a strong start as the team opened the season with a home sweep of Michigan State during Great Lake State Weekend and remained undefeated until Oct. 29, 2017 (5-1-0). Among the team's most notable victories during the season was a win against No. 10 ranked Minnesota State at home which led to the Lakers earning a spot in the national rankings (No. 20) on Nov. 7, 2016 for the first time since Jan. 6, 2014. Lake State would finish the season with a 11-18-7 record and a 8-13-7 WCHA record, and extended the program's playoff streak to three seasons. Whitten's Lakers fell in the first round of the WCHA playoffs to Michigan Tech. Forward Mitch Hults was named to the All-WCHA Second Team while freshman forward Max Humitz was named to the All-WCHA Rookie Team.

Whitten's Lakers nearly doubled their win total from the previous season in 2015-16 with a 14-22-5 record and a 11-15-5 mark in WCHA competition. For the second consecutive year, the Lakers would qualify for the WCHA playoffs and would face the Minnesota State Mavericks in the first round. The Lakers would force a decisive third game in the series but the Mavericks would eliminate the Lakers from postseason play. Lakers goalie Gordon Defiel was named to the All-WCHA Third Team.

In his first season as the Lakers head coach, Whitten guided the team to a 8-28-2 overall record which included a 7-20-1 record in conference play. Some of the notable victories during the 2014-15 season included a road win against No. 6 ranked Bowling Green and a pair of wins at the Florida College Hockey Classic to clinch the tournament title. The team qualified for the WCHA playoffs but fell in the first round to Minnesota State.

Prior to Lake Superior State, Whitten served as an assistant coach at Michigan Tech from 2010-14. He was responsible for in-game defensive matchups and academic performance, while also assisting with all facets of practice, game preparation and recruiting as a member of Head Coach Mel Pearson's staff. During his first season (2010-11) at MTU, the Huskies enjoyed their best start since 1972 and claimed a berth among the 2011-12 Western Collegiate Hockey Association Final Five.

Whitten spent two seasons (2008-10) as the director of hockey operations at his alma mater, Michigan State, working under two-time American Hockey Coaches Association (AHCA) Spencer Penrose NCAA Division I National Coach of the Year and former LSSU great, Rick Comley, His responsibilities included video work, budget management, travel coordination, and booster/alumni relations.

Before his most recent stint at Michigan State, Whitten was an assistant coach at Alaska Anchorage for two seasons (2006-08) on Dave Shyiak's staff after spending the two previous years (2004-06) as an assistant coach at Wayne State under Head Coach Bill Wilkinson.

A 2001 graduate of Michigan State, Whitten played for the Spartans under legendary and U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame coach Ron Mason from 1997-01. He received a bachelor's degree in communication from MSU and then earned a master's in sports administration from Michigan State in 2005. He also served as a volunteer graduate assistant coach at MSU during the 2004-05 season.

While playing at MSU, the Spartans amassed an impressive 122-28-20 overall record to go along with three Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) regular-season titles, three CCHA playoff championships, and two NCAA Tournament Frozen Four appearances. Whitten was an assistant captain of a senior class that owns the Spartans' all-time highest win percentage. During his final season, MSU led the nation in goals-against (1.36) and penalty killing (.911).

Whitten accumulated 75 career points (35-40-75) in 166 games at Michigan State as a left winger. A three-time academic All-Big Ten Conference At Large honoree, Whitten was also nominted twice for the NCAA Hockey Humanitarian Award. As a senior at MSU, Whitten was named the recipient of the Blue Line President's Award as the top scholar-athlete in the senior class and was presented the Amo Bessone Award for outstanding athletic, scholastic, and community participation.

A native of Brighton, Mich., Whitten played two seasons of professional hockey in the ECHL. He skated the 2001-02 season with the Greenville Grrrowl (S.C.) and helped the Grrrowl claim the ECHL's Kelly Cup championship title in 2001-02 by scoring 32 points (9-23-32) in 64 regular-season games and tallying five points (2-3-5) in 15 playoff appearances. The following season (2002-03), Whitten competed for the Arkansas RiverBlades, located in North Little Rock, Ark., collecting 39 points (12-27--39) in 69 games.

Whitten and his wife, Angie, live in Sault Ste. Marie, Mich. with their son, Joey, and daughter, Flossie.







ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH MIKE YORK

Mike York, a collegiate All-American and a 10-year veteran of the National Hockey League, enters his fifth season with the Lake Superior State Hockey program in 2021-22. In July, York was promoted to Associate Head Coach and agreed to terms on a multiyear contract extension. Previously, York served as an assistant coach since joining the Lakers in July 2017.

York joined the Lakers staff in July 2017 after returning to his alma mater, Michigan State, in a student assistant coaching capacity during the 2016-17 while he completed his degree requirements.

York, who was drafted in the sixth round by the New York Rangers in the 1997 NHL Entry Draft, played 10 seasons in the NHL. York skated with the New York Rangers, Edmonton Oilers, New York Islanders, Philadelphia Flyers, Phoenix Coyotes, and Columbus Blue Jackets. A native of Waterford, Mich., York's career achievements include being named to the 1999-00 NHL All-Rookie team, receiving a silver medal as a member of Team USA at the 2002 Winter Olympics and playing in the 2002 NHL All-Star Game.

Prior to his 17-year professional career, York was a two-time (1997-99) first-team All-America selection, a two-time Hobey Baker Award finalist, and the 1999 Central Collegiate Hockey Association Player of the Year during his four seasons (1995-99) at Michigan State under Head Coach Ron Mason.

York lives in Sault Ste. Marie, Mich. with his wife, Aimee and their two children, Ivy and Connor



ASSISTANT COACH DJ GOLDSTEIN

DJ Goldstein enters his first year as a volunteer assistant coach with the Lake Superior State hockey team in 2021-22.

Goldstein is involved in all aspects of the daily operations of the coaching staff while also assisting in hockey operations, and managing organizational film analysis and breakdown.

Goldstein joins the Lakers after spending the last few years as the head coach of the Rochester Coalition Under 18 Team as well as an assistant coach for the Canandaigua Academy Boys Varsity Hockey Team. Rochester won the USA Hockey Under 18 Tier I National Championship in 2021.

Goldstein played Division III NCAA hockey at Nichols College in Dudley, Mass. where he served as team captain during his senior season. Prior to playing at Nichols, Goldstein spent two seasons playing for the Rochester Jr. Americans in the USPHL (2012-14) and four years playing for Canandaigua Academy (2008-12).

A native of Canandaigua, N.Y., Goldstein graduated from Nichols College with a bachelor's degree in business administration in 2017 and a masters of business administration in 2018. Goldstein currently resides in Sault Ste. Marie, Mich.



GOALTENDING COACH/DIR. PLAYER DEVELOPMENT DWAYNE ROLOSON

Roloson enters his first season with the Lakers as the program's Goaltending Coach and Director of Player Development on a volunteer basis in 2022-23.

Roloson brings an extensive hockey background, including playing over 600 games for six teams over the course of a 14-year career in the National Hockey League, making him the second coach currently with the program that has significant NHL experience along with Associate Head Coach and fellow former NHL All-Star, Mike York.

After his playing career, Roloson returned to his alma mater where he served as an assistant coach before taking a position as a goaltending consultant with the Anaheim Ducks for three seasons. He would then continue coaching the sport he loves for one season with the Shawnigan Lake School U15 Prep team and five seasons with the Victoria Royals of the Western Hockey League.

As a player, Roloson was signed as a free agent by the Calgary Flames after graduating from the University of Massachusetts Lowell, and he would make his NHL debut in 1996 when he

recorded 35 saves in a 3-3 tie against the Dallas Stars. After earning a roster spot with the Minnesota Wild in 2001, he made his first NHL All-Star appearance in 2004, and he went on to win the Roger Crozier Saving Grace Award for having the NHL's best save percentage. On March 8, 2006, he was traded to the Edmonton Oilers, and he helped them make an improbable run to the Stanley Cup Finals a few months later when he went 12-5 while also recording the most saves (573) in the postseason before spraining his MCL in Game 1 of the Stanley Cup Finals against the Carolina Hurricanes. Two years later, he posted an NHL career-high 28 wins in the 2008-09 season, and he signed with the New York Islanders the following offseason. He would go on to be traded to the Tampa Bay Lightning in January 2011 where he would finish his playing career. After the trade, he would have four shutouts in his first 11 games with the Lightning, and he would have one final playoff run in which he posted a 10-6 record before falling to the eventual champions, the Boston Bruins, in Game 7 of the Eastern Conference Finals.

In addition to his time with the NHL, Roloson was also a member of the Canadian National Team, and he won the gold medal at the 2007 IHF World Championships in Moscow with a 4-2 win over Finland.




