BADGERS GO FOR SECOND KWIK TRIP HOLIDAY FACE-OFF TITLE

- Wisconsin (7-11-0) returns to the Kwik Trip Holiday Face-Off on Wednesday and Thursday, Dec. 28-29, at Fiserv Forum in Milwaukee. The Badgers captured the inaugural event last year with an overtime win over Yale in the semifinals and a shootout victory over No. 16 Providence to win the title.
- The Badgers open the 2022 event with a semifinal game against Lake Superior State (3-13-2) on Wednesday, Dec. 28 at 7:30 p.m., then play again on Thursday, Dec. 29 at 7:30 p.m. against either UMass (7-6-3) or Clarkson (7-8-2) depending on semifinal results. Should the Badgers defeat LSSU, their game on Dec. 29 will serve as the championship game.
- Wednesday's game airs on Bally Sports Wisconsin Extra, while Thursday's contest airs on Bally Sports Wisconsin.
- The Badgers will be without freshman forward Charlie Stramel, who is away playing for the U.S. National Junior Team at the 2023 World Junior Championship in New Brunswick and Nova Scotia in Canada.



Junior forward Mathieu De St. Phalle was the 2021 Kwik Trip Face-Off Most Outstanding Forward after scoring two of UW's four goals. He had four points on the season before the tourney, then put up 18 points in his final 19 games including the event.

KEY NOTES TO CONSIDER

- 2021 and 2017 Big Ten Coach of the Year and 2018 U.S. Olympic Team coach Tony Granato leads the Badgers in his seventh season behind the bench. The 13-year NHL veteran and 13-year NHL head and assistant coach was an All-American as a player at Wisconsin and is part of the UW Athletic and U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame.
- UW junior forward Mathieu De St. Phalle and sophomore defenseman Corson Ceulemans were the 2021 Kwik Trip Holiday Face-Off Most Outstanding Forward and Defenseman, respectively.
- Fifth-year senior forward Brock Caufield scored the overtime game-winning goal in the semifinals last year to give the Badgers a 3-2 victory over Yale, while sophomore forward Zach Urdaahl scored the shootout game-winning goal in the sixth round to give the Badgers the tourney title after skating to a 2-2 overtime tie with No. 16 Providence.
- Urdaahl scored his first career goal in the opener against Yale.
- Senior goaltender Jared Moe made 50 saves on 54 shots and five stops on six shootout attempts to backstop the Badgers to the 2021 tourney crown.
- UW led the Yale game 2-0 before winning 3-2 in overtime and trailed 2-0 to start the third period against No. 16 Providence before coming back for the tournament victory.
- In UW's most recent game this season against Minnesota on Dec. 10, junior defenseman Luke LaMaster recorded his first career point with an assist on UW's third goal of the game. The Duluth, Minnesota, native was skating in his 47th career game.
- A pair of Badgers scored their first goals of the season in that Dec. 10 game at Minnesota. Junior defenseman and alternate captain Anthony Kehrer

BY THE NUMBERS

The 2022-23 campaign marks the 74th season of Wisconsin men's hockey dating back to the 1921-22 season and the 60th in the modern era (since 1963) when the program was restarted after a nearly 30 years hiatus.

tallied his first goal of the season and second of his career, ending a 22-game goal drought. Kehrer has skated in 85 career contests. He last scored Feb. 12 against Notre Dame.

- Sophomore forward Liam Malmquist snapped his own 28-game goal drought with his second career tally in 50 career contests. He last scored Jan. 24 against Michigan State.
- Senior forward Owen Lindmark leads the Big Ten with a 61.5 face off win percentage (187-117).
- Lindmark has teamed up with freshman forward Jack Horbach as a top penalty-kill unit for the Badgers.
- Lindmark is tied for the national lead with six career short-handed goals. He also shares the Big Ten lead with a pair of short-handed tallies.
- Horbach also boasts a short-handed tally.
- Sophomore defenseman Corson Ceulemans had his four-game point streak snapped (3g, 3a) on Friday, Dec. 9, at Minnesota, but added a goal on Dec. 10 to give him four goals and seven points over the last six contests. He ranks second on the Badgers with 12 points and third with five goals.
- Freshman forward Charlie Stramel was invited to the U.S. National Junior Team camp that ran Dec. 12-17 at USA Hockey Arena in Plymouth, Michigan as one of 32 players. He made the 25-man cut and is expected to play at the 2023 World Junior Championship that runs Dec. 26 - Jan. 5, 2023 in Halifax, Nova Scotia, and Moncton, New Brunswick, Canada, so will miss the Kwik Trip Holiday Face-Off. Stramel also played in the rescheduled 2022 World Junior Championship that took place this past August.
- Stramel recorded just one goal and one assist in the first 11 games of the season, but has three goals and five points over the last seven games for the Badgers. He is projected as a potential first-round pick for the 2023 NHL Draft.
- Stramel tallied two goals, including a short-handed marker, and one assist in two pretournament wins over Finland and Sweden.
- Sophomore forward Brayden Morrison left the Badgers at the break and now skates for the USHL's Dubuque Fighting Saints.
- The Badgers had their five-game win streak snapped on Dec. 3 after sweeping LIU and Lindenwood, and knocking off No. 5 Michigan. It was the longest win streak since the Badgers won five-straight contests from Feb. 26 to March 15, 2021.
- The Badger penalty kill was a perfect 8-for-8 against No. 5 Michigan the first weekend of December and had climbed over 80 percent for the first time this season at 81.8 percent (54-for-66) before allowing four power-play goals on 11 chances in its most recent weekend at Minnesota and now sits at 78.7 percent on the penalty kill.
- Wisconsin allowed seven power-play goals in the season's first five games, but just five in the past 11 contests. One of those was an own goal with its goaltender pulled during a delayed penalty call against Lindenwood.
- The Badger power play has eight goals over the last six games and at least one power-play goal in seven of the last nine contests.
- The UW power play is succeeding on 16.7 percent of its chances (13-78) for the season.
- UW ranks fifth in the nation and second in the Big Ten with a 54.5 faceoff win percentage (582-485). Minnesota State leads the nation at 59.5 percent.
- The Badgers return their top three point-getters from last season in junior forward Mathieu De St. Phalle (10-12=22), sophomore defenseman Corson

Ceulemans (7-15=22) and graduate student Brock Caufield (7-12=19).

- Wisconsin welcomes back 73.7 percent of its goals (56 of 76), 71.1 percent of its assists (86 of 121) and 72.1 of its points (142 of 197) from last year's team for the 2022-23 season.
- The Badgers boast seven seniors or graduate students on the roster this season led by fifth-year Badgers Dominick Mersch, Brock Caufield and Jack Gorniak. That also includes defenseman Mike Vorlicky and forward Owen Lindmark, who missed all and most of last season due to injury, respectively.
- Sophomore defenseman Corson Ceulemans and junior forward Mathieu De St. Phalle were named preseason All-Big Ten honorable mention by Big Ten coaches.

SUTER NIGHT - FRIDAY, DEC. 2

As part of 'Throwback Weekend' at the Kohl Center, the Wisconsin men's hockey program honored the Suter family on Friday, Dec. 2, throughout its 6-3 victory over No. 5 Michigan. That included a ceremonial puck drop with Marlowe, John, Mary (Bob's wife) and Gary Suter.

Dating back to high school and amateur hockey in the 1950s, continuing through the arrival of Bob Johnson and beyond, the Suter family has left a lasting impression on state, Madison and Wisconsin hockey.

From patriarch Marlowe Suter's time sharpening skated, serving as goal judge and manning the Dane County Coliseum penalty box and handing out Milk Duds to penalized Badgers, three generations of Suters have left their mark at Wisconsin.

It continued when Marlowe's sons John and Bob Suter helped the Badgers capture the 1977 NCAA Championship and Bob won gold as part of the Miracle on Ice at the 1980 Olympic Winter Games.

A third son, Gary, skated for the Badgers in the mid-1980s and went on to Olympic, international and NHL acclaim.

Both Bob and Gary are members of the U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame and Wisconsin Athletic Hall of Fame.

A third generation joined the legacy when Bob's son Ryan became a Badger in the early 2000s and has since carried on the Olympic, international and NHL family tradition.

It isn't just Badger hockey, but Madison-area hockey where the Suter family has impacted the game. From the Madison Cardinals, Suter's Gold Medal Sports, the Madison Capitols youth hockey programs, Sun Prairie hockey and Bob Suter's Capitol Ice Arena, among others, the family's impact carries forward.

BADGERS AND THE NHL

- Sophomore defenseman Corson Ceulemans became the 17th all-time Badger drafted in the first round of the NHL draft when the Columbus Blue Jackets picked him 25th overall in the 2021 draft. He was the fifth Badger in five years picked in the first round (K'Andre Miller, Alex Turcotte, Cole Caufield, Dylan Holloway) and the seventh in seven drafts (Luke Kunin, Trent Frederic).
- UW boasts 10 NHL draft picks on its roster, including freshman forward Cruz Lucius, who went to the Carolina Hurricanes in the fourth round of the 2022 draft with the 124th pick.
- UW boasts 176 NHL draft picks all-time, including three in the supplemental draft, and have had at least one player drafted in each draft since 1970 except for 1983 and 1997.
- Eight Badgers selected in 1982 are the most for one year.
- Former Wisconsin captain Ryan McDonagh became the 14th Badger to get his name engraved on the Stanley Cup as a player when he helped the Tampa Bay Lightning to the 2020 Stanley Cup. That is the most among NCAA schools. He won again in 2021.
 
- All time, a Badger is on the Cup 22 times as a player, also the most of any NCAA school.
- Ryan McDonagh's Tampa Bay Lightning defeated Joe Pavelski's Dallas Stars to win the Stanley Cup in 2020, then defeated Cole Caufield's Montreal Canadiens in 2021. That made him the fourth Badger to win consecutive Cups (Justin Schultz, Paul Stanton, Brian Engblom).
- McDonagh now plays for the Nashville Predators.
- The 2022-23 season marks the 33rd consecutive season a UW goaltender is playing in the NHL.
- San Jose Sharks forward Luke Kunin recorded his 100th career NHL point on Nov. 15, 2022, to become the 33rd Badger all-time with 100 career NHL points. Chicago Blackhawks defenseman Jake McCabe reached the mark earlier this season.
- As of Monday, Nov. 28, Joe Pavelski had 948 career points in the NHL regular season which ties him for the all-time Badger NHL scoring lead with Chris Chelios.
